



## DOG FRIENDLY WALKS AND SWIMS ON THE GRANITE BELT

- Quart Pot Creek Park is dog friendly and there is an off-leash area which you can access from Connor Street between Talc Street and Britannia Street, or Allison Street, off Archibald Street.
- The Severn River bank has shade and some dirt tracks for walking, as well as the sandy river bank. You can access the river bank area from Severnlea via Stables Road or from Glen Aplin via Mount Stirling Road.
- The reserve on Bent's Road runs alongside the Severn River, with a small swimming hole and a large grassed area and can be accessed by a small, unsignposted dirt track on your right opposite Gibb's Lane.
- Anderson's Road, just south of Ballandean on the left hand side of the New England Highway, has a small swimming hole 3kms in from the turn off, on Bald Rock Creek.
- Donnelly's Castle, accessed from Amiens Road, is nor National Park and has a small BBQ area, toilets and a lookout. Good for picnics with your dog.
- Storm King Dam, to the south-east of town, is accessed via Eukey Road. The southern part, near the causeway, is best for swimming with dogs, as powered crafts are not allowed in the narrow tail of the dam. Turn into Sugarload Road, (just up the hill from the Information Centre) and follow the signs. Bush camping is not allowed at the dam, but there is a dog friendly camp ground, Sommerville Valley, on the eastern bank.
- Undercliffe Falls, east of Liston on the NSW side of the border, isn't National Park and dogs are allowed, although it is part of cattle property and dogs that are likely to chase cows should be restrained. This is also an area notorious for having a lot of snakes and cattle ticks have been found there, so please exercise caution and check your canine thoroughly after swimming or walking.
- Mt Marley has a reasonably steep walking trail where well-behaved dogs on leads are welcome.

Please pick up after your dog. Stop them from chasing wildlife or stock and discourage them from eating small children and we can all continue to enjoy our swims and walks.
